

# Corrections to the Norm

During the course of researching information in genealogy, you start with existing known information as a starting point. As I was doing this with the current Deissinger information, I found there were some items to existing Internet information needing correction. Here is the list that I have found so far:

1. Existing information has incomplete information on Barthel Deissinger's first wife. Barthel Deissinger first wife's name is Maria Magdalena Raab, daughter of Andreas Raab of Rodenbach, Germany

2. Henrich Deissinger was baptized on November 12, 1729, not January 12, 1730 as currently exists. Upon researching the Steinwenden records, I could see this error occurring because Henrich's name is faint to read. However, the month of November is easy to read from the record and this is before the 1730 records began.

3. The Unknown Child's name to Barthel Deissinger is Anna Eva. There were 3 Anna Eva and here is their information:

- Anna Eva (I) – Jan. 20, 1709 – Apr. 1, 1711
- Anna Eva (II) – Feb. 19, 1713 – Unknown
- Anna Eva (III) – Apr. 11, 1723 – Sept. 27, 1724

The unknown child is currently listed as being born on Apr. 11, 1723. However, a post-edit in the Steinwenden records indicates the child was named Anna Eva. In addition, the death record for Anna Eva on Sept. 27, 1724 lists the child's age as 1.5 years old at death.

4. I have found a complete list of the Deissingers coming on the ship Patience. I've seen variations of this list showing only Barthel

and Henrich arriving to Barthel, Henrich, and Johan Wilhelm coming to America. After some digging, I have found this list of family descendents:

- Barthel Deissinger
- Anna Barbara Bernhard
- Maria Magdalena
- Catharina Barbara with child
- Johann Jacob
- Heinrich Erasmus
- Johann Wilhelm

This list, in my opinion, brings up new investigations on the U.S. side of the family.
